

Eloise (Hanson) Beckman

Born: May 5, 1936 in Osakis, MN. Where she lived and married in 1954 to Laverne (Red) Beckman (passed away in 2009).

Both Red and Eloise joined the VFW in Osakis in 1958.

They were blessed with 5 children - Kari Lynn, Cindy, Tim, Paul and Joey (passed away in 2021).



The family moved to Blaine in 1968, they then transferred their membership to Sgt. John Rice VFW #6316.

Eloise sold real estate for 10 years after the children were school age.

She was one of a few that were instrumental in getting a kitchen started about 1970.

Offices held: president 3 years, Sr. Vice, Jr. Vice, color guard, district hospitality chairperson for 2 years.

And currently hospital chairperson and funeral luncheon director.

Other activities she participates in are sewing and bingo at the vets home, Park River and Benedictine.

She helps serve the veterans coffee and rolls the second Monday of the month at 10:00 am at the post.

Eloise received her 65 year pin last November at the veterans dinner. Congratulations on a lifelong commitment to our veterans.

Veteran Spotlight

Tom Nielsen Born July 6, 1950

Drafted into the U.S. Army directly out of high school at age 18. September 1969 and medically discharged September 1971. After completing basic training for infantry at Fort Bragg, N.C. and after some specialty training he was assigned a tour to Vietnam. Stationed in the delta about 25 miles



from Saigon, while walking the rice paddies after being dropped off by a helicopter he and another soldier came under fire and Tom was shot in his left thigh 3 times. Fortunately they did not hit the bone. While at the hospital in Saigon he was presented with a combat injury medal "purple heart". After a 3-week stay Tom was transferred to Japan for further recuperation. From Japan to the great lakes hospital in the U.S. for another few weeks, he was able to go home on furlough for 30 days. Tacoma, WA was his next assignment with the tanker unit, obviously not healed sufficiently he reinjured his leg and while in the hospital a 4 star general approached Tom to ask if he would want a medical discharge and Tom accepted! Discharged as a PFC.

Tom returned home. Said he played for a while and then started working for Hypro Pumps in New Brighton, where he stayed for 40 years.

Tom was married and had 2 children, a boy and a girl, and now has 5 grandchildren and they all live close. Tom joined the VFW in 1993.

While interviewing Tom on "Purple Heart Day" I asked what freedom meant to him? He replied, "We have freedom due to our troops."

Thank you Tom for your bravery and service!

POW/MIA Recognition DAy

In 1979, through a proclamation from President Jimmy Carter, POW/MIA Recognition Day was first acknowledged. From then on each President has signed an annual proclamation.

"YOU ARE NOT FORGOTTEN" - a phrase behind the POW/MIA remembrance movement honoring America's prisoners of war, those who are still missing in action and their families.

Many of our service members suffered as prisoners of war. Some made it home, tens of thousands more never did.

POW/MIA Recognition Day is commemorated the third Friday in Sept.

During the first POW/MIA Recognition Day commemoration a ceremony was held at the National Cathedral in Washington DC, while the 1st Tactical Squadron from Langley Air Force Base in Virginia flew the missing man formation.

The point of POW/MIA Recognition Day is to ensure that Americans remember to stand behind those who serve and to make sure we do everything we can to account for those who have never returned. The POW/MIA Flag - In 1971 Mary Hoff contacted a flag company to see whether a flag reminding people of POW's and the missing could be made. World War II pilot Newt Heisley designed the flag which was made in Black and White to represent the sorrow, anxiety and hope symbolized by the image of the gaunt man featured on it. For every POW/MIA Recognition Day since 1982, the flag has flown just below the stars and stripes at the White House - the only other flag to ever do so.

In 1998, Congress ordered it to also be displayed on Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day.

The first POW/MIA Poster, "Keeping the Promise" was made in 1999. Since then each year there is a new design. The 2023 Poster is "their sacrifice is not forgotten".

A career soldier who gave his life for his country. Denied burial in Sioux City, Iowa, because of his race. Through the intercession of President Truman, Sergeant John Rice was buried with honors at Arlington National Cemetery, Arlington, Virginia.
